

# FIRST AID KITS

In a partnership with the Osceola School District, Sheriff Christopher A. Blackmon and the Osceola Sheriff's office purchased and placed advanced first aid kits in every high school in Osceola County.



These first aid kits contain the latest in life saving technology to assist in the initial care of trauma patients.

School resource officers will have access to the latest in first line aid, for traumatic injuries that could occur at high schools.

## The Kit

This emergency response kit includes essential supplies to help manage severe bleeding, cardiac arrest, seizures, choking and other life threatening situations.

The durable, water resistant case protects the supplies, while the Mobilize Rescue App provides step by step guidance to help anyone respond quickly and confidently during an emergency.

Many people think of School Resource Officers as just someone who watches over the campus. In fact, SROs are much more involved in the daily life of a school.

Students often go to an SRO first when something feels wrong. SROs help calm tense situations, listen when a child needs support, and step in early to stop small problems from becoming bigger ones.

School safety is about more than doors, drills, or emergency plans. It depends on trust. When students feel safe to speak up, adults can help more effectively. This trust also includes families and teachers, so everyone shares responsibility for student well-being.

SROs work with school staff to help students dealing with stress, anxiety, or personal challenges. Sometimes, just being there, listening without judgment, and making a student feel noticed and supported is what matters most.

This role does not mean moving away from law enforcement. It means getting closer to the community. By building relationships, offering guidance, and responding when needed, School Resource Officers help make schools safer and healthier for everyone.

Despite her treatment, she continues to support her students, carry out her responsibilities as SRO, raise awareness about women's health, and help those who need it.

Her story shows how hope, perseverance, and compassion can make a difference every day.



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
## PROGRAMS THAT INSPIRE
